

Christos Loukos was born in Athens in 1944. He graduated in 1967 from the Faculty of Letters (Department of History and Archaeology) of the University of Athens. In the same Faculty he obtained a PhD in History. From 1974-1992 he was researcher at the Academy of Athens (Research Center for Modern Greek History). Between 1982-1985 he made postgraduate studies in Paris. From 1992-2011 he was Assistant Professor and after Professor at the Department of History and Archaeology of the Faculty of Letters of the University of Crete. Emeritus professor of this University. He was the Director of the research program “The City in Modern Times” at the Institute for Mediterranean Studies (Rethymno, Crete). He researched, wrote and taught the Greek Revolution of 1821, Social Issues of Modern Greek Cities with emphasis in Hermoupolis of Syros, History of Greek Typography, Introduction to the History of Latin America.
