

**Information Notice for the processing of personal data
in the frame of submitting Applications for becoming a member
in the institution of Academic Associate (Fellow)**

1. Controller: The civil non-profit company with the name "Research Centre for the Humanities", based in Athens (38 Skoufa Street, 106 72, Tax Identification Number 997241617).

2. Personal data: All the information you submit with your Application to become a member in the institution of the Academic Associate (Fellow) (indicatively CV, description of the proposed research, etc.)

3. Purpose of processing: The purpose of the collection of the aforementioned data is the evaluation of your Application to become a member in the institution of the Academic Associate (Fellow).

4. Legal basis for processing: Your consent.

5. Access to the data: Recipients of the aforementioned personal data are the people responsible for the evaluation of the relevant Applications, appointed by the Controller. These people are bound by confidentiality and protection of personal data clauses. The Controller implements appropriate technical and organizational measures in order to ensure the appropriate level of security against the risk of loss of your aforementioned personal data or of unauthorized use or access to them.

6. Retention period of personal data: If your Application is not selected, your personal data will be deleted immediately after this non-selection. If your application is selected, you will be informed with a new relevant Notice regarding their further processing.

7. Rights: You retain the following rights:

- i. Right to withdraw consent.
- ii. Right of access.
- iii. Right of rectification.
- iv. Right of restriction.
- v. Right of objection.
- vi. Right to erasure.

You can exercise your rights by sending an e-mail to info@rchumanities.gr or a letter to our postal address or by submitting the request to us in person, at the address of our headquarters.

We also point out that the exercise of the right of objection or erasure does not imply the immediate erasure of data or the modification of the processing. In any case, we will provide you a detailed answer as soon as possible, within the deadlines set by the GDPR.

8. Right to file a complaint: In case you consider that the processing of your personal data violates Regulation (EU) 2016/679, you have the right to file a complaint to a supervisory authority.
